
Glockenspiel



MES Soprano Glockenspiel



Glockenspiel, pronounced GLOCK-en-shpeel is a German word. Glocke means bell Spiel means play

Delightful percussion instrument with a bell-like sound. Similar to the xylophone but instead of wooden bars uses metal bars that produce a higher pitch.

Great for...

- Identifying different sounds.
- Playing a tuned instrument.
- Copying simple rhythmic patterns.
- Beginning to understand musical notations and identifying minims, croquets, quavers and rests.
- Rehearsing and learning to play simple melodic instrumental parts.
- Working together in a band/ensemble.
- Making and combining sounds to compose music.



Learn with Glockenspiel



The Glockenspiel is played with mallets. Different sounds can be created with different mallets. A hard mallet producing a bright sharp sound and a soft mallet a more muted sound. Experiment with the sounds that can be made.



Experience and learn how to apply key musical elements such as pulse, clapping a rhythm and using pitch.

Rhythm makes a pattern of sounds Clap clap-clap clap clap clapclap, Pulse will keep a steady beat Hear the marching of the feet.

Pitch are sounds high or low Tempo means go fast or slow, Dynamics can go with a BANG! Or make sounds as softly as you can. **Timbre** is the type of sound you hear, Instruments playing differently in your ear.

Duration can be short or long, Structure is the verse and chorus of a song. Texture is the layers of sound Hear them when we create a round, Listen and copy the rhythmic patterns, Made of minims, quavers and crotchets.


Try longer patterns. Play instrumental parts with increasing confidence.
