

How to guide...Light Up Infinity Mirror (EY11032)



What is it?

The light up circular infinity mirror is an absolute sensory dream to any visual sensory seekers! Children of all ages will love looking at their reflections and gazing into the illusion of a sparkly tunnel. It is a wall-mounted wooden mirror with an infinity effect surface that glows. Think a mirror, but a million times more inviting, sensory, engaging, and fun to explore!



Who would use it?

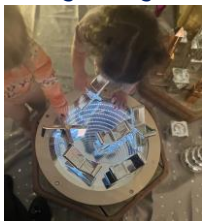
This can be used by all children, but those who require a sensory diet may particularly benefit from the use of this resource within their day.



Why would it be used?

This sensory light-up infinity mirror could be used for a variety of reasons:

- Firstly, it's a great resource for any children who are visual sensory seekers. It creates the illusion of a tunnel, so not only do they have reflections to look at, but also the infinity tunnel and glowing lights.
- It could be a tool for the child to access quickly within the environment to feel 'just right', regulated, and ready to learn.
- All children would benefit from accessing the mirror for mindfulness and calming moments. Punctuating the day with moments of calm, to reset and process will support their overall wellbeing.
- You could also use the mirror to engage, inspire, and spark imaginations! Put your mirror up next to a variety of props that could be used for role play, for example, space suits or alien toys. Could the children be on a spaceship zooming to Mars? Disco balls or microphones. Could the children be performing a song on stage?



The key here is that if we allow children the time, tools, and space to incorporate the mirror into their play, they will often lead it in such imaginative ways that we could never dream of – the possibilities are endless!

How is it used?

Simply attach the mirror to the wall or place it on the floor and let your children explore. They will have endless fun peering in, touching it, and moving around to watch their reflection dance in the sparkly glow. This could be part of a sensory room or simply a sensory space within a classroom or setting. It's really important to make sure the mirror is placed at the child's height (or lower) so it's accessible for them to access.

In summary...

The light up infinity mirror is a fabulous resource that provides a soothing, calming, inquisitive sensory glow and tunnel – perfect for helping children to regulate whilst also inspiring a world of imagination!
